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### Part L consultation proposals

#### **Aims**

- Take a meaningful step towards zero carbon, whilst respecting deregulatory commitments
- Recognise the opportunity of the introduction of the Green Deal to drive retrofit agenda

#### **Process**

- Part of the wider Building Regulations review package
- Proposals draw heavily on input from industry working groups, the Hub and BRAC over summer 2011. Contributions have been (and will continue to be) vital to the process
- 12 week consultation on most elements, but accelerated timetable (8 weeks) for elements which link to DECC's Green Deal timetable



## Part L consultation proposals

#### New homes:

- Two options for 2013 **improvement in CO<sub>2</sub> performance standards** broadly equivalent to introducing FEES, and more ambitious 'halfway' to 2016 Hub targets
- Introduce an 'absolute' regulatory energy demand target either at
  - full 39/46kWh/m²/year FEES levels, or
  - less demanding interim levels of 43/52kWh/m²/year to provide some flexibility for sites where full FEES is hard to meet. Designers could still build to full FEES levels where economic.
- **Compliance and Performance**: Proposals to use quality assurance processes to help ensure as-designed performance of new homes is delivered on completion

### **New non-domestic buildings**

•Two options for aggregate improvements in CO<sub>2</sub> standards – 11% and 20%.

### **Existing buildings**

- 'Consequential improvements' to drive retrofit of existing stock
- Phased introduction start with domestic extensions from Oct 12
