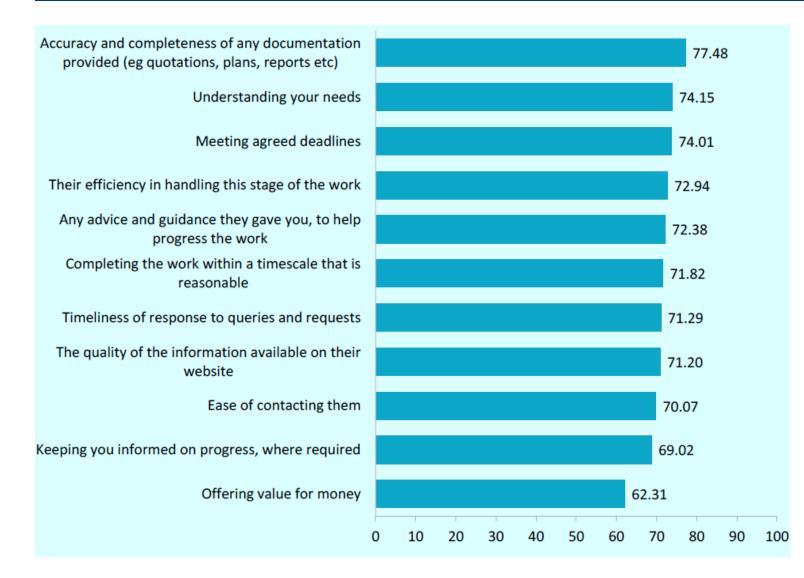

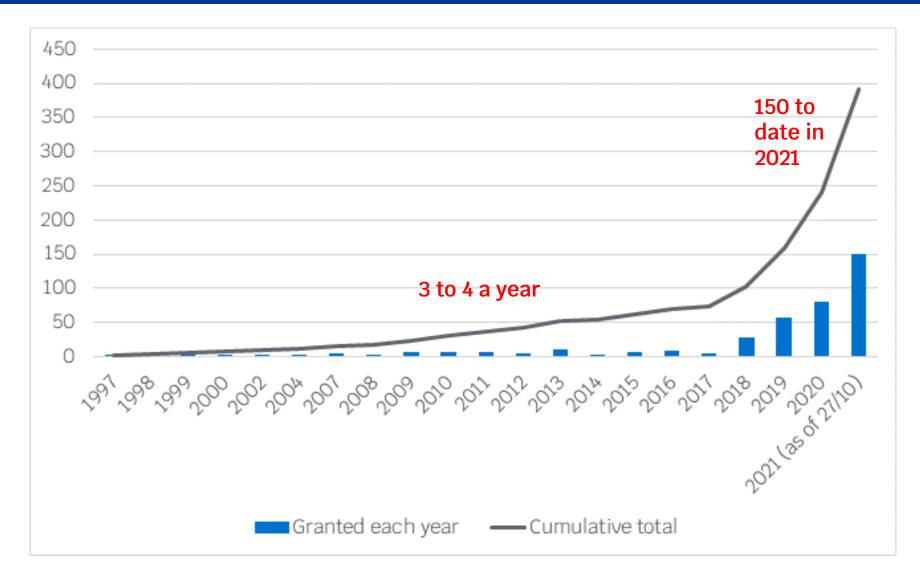

Charges (English companies)

End customers do not fund companies' costs that are incurred as a consequence of new developments or vice versa.

- □ Remove pegging to pre-2018 levels
- Discounts or surcharges have clear rationale disallow income offset
- □ Further consideration of implementation
